Yerba Buena Gardens Festival Seed Commissions program was launched in 2020 to celebrate the Festival's 20th Anniversary and has evolved to address the acute needs of Bay Area artists during the pandemic. Now in its 4th year, the Seed Commissions program has awarded over 60 commissions to "seed" and actively support the creation and presentation of original works by the Bay Area's most innovative and influential artists. The YBGF Seed Festival on August 17 is a one-day celebration of these artists and the conversations that arise between them, in music, dance, spoken word, storytelling and more. Featured artists in this unique day of collaboration include local luminaires Alleluia Panis, Mahealani Uchiyama, Vân-Ánh Võ, Esotérica Tropical, Rocky Rivera, Lalin St. Juste, Kev Choice, and RyanNicole.

Salsa at Jessie, the open-air salsa dance party in Jessie Square (near the Contemporary Jewish Museum and St. Patrick's Church), from 6:00pm – 7:30pm. The series includes Orquesta la Moderna Tradición on August 1, Jesus Diaz y su QBA on September 5, and Agua Pura on October 3.

Dance has always been a major part of the Yerba Buena Gardens Festival. This season, RAWdance will perform "Drawing on a Decade" on Friday, June 14 and Saturday, June 15 to celebrate its 20th year of performance, curation, collaboration, and creating site specific work at Yerba Buena Gardens. YBG ChoreoFest on Saturday, July 13 and Saturday, July 20 is the two-weekend festival of site-specific work that showcases the extravagant creativity, diversity, and vibrancy of the Bay Area dance scene. This years YBG ChoreoFest artists include David Herrera Performance Company, Diamano Coura West African Dance Company, OYSTERKNIFE, pateldanceworks, PUSH Dance Company, Rogelio Lopez, Surabhi Bharadwaj and TURFFEINZ. Enjoy dance battles at Get Free Festival on July 6, an open-air dance studio at YBG Dance Day on September 28, traditional dance forms at Islands by the Bay on May 19, Native Contemporary Arts Festival on June 16, the African Arts Festival on September 7, American Bon Dancing on September 8, and SF Indigenous Peoples Day on October 14.

Yerba Buena Gardens Festival will present festivals and cultural celebrations with a wide-range of partners. **Rhythm & Motion** will host outdoor dance classes every Wednesday from noon to 1:00pm, starting in April; **CAAMFest: Directions in Sound** on May 18 is a partnership with the Center for Asian American Media; **Islands By The Bay Festival** on May 19 was created by Legacies of the Pacific to promote collaboration and building cultural bridges by presenting an array of Bay Area AAPI artists; the **26th**

Annual Native Contemporary Arts Festival on June 16 will have a diverse array of Native music, dance, vendors, and crafts; the Get Free Fest on July 6 is presented by Embodiment Project, the annual street dance festival rooted in the artistry of freestyling, experimental battling, healing through community practices and the Bay Area street dance community; Sameer Gupta's Color Your Mind Festival on July 27 is curated by percussionist Gupta and will expand the boundaries of Indian classical music; the 5th Annual African Arts Festival on September 7, co-presented by Duniya Dance and Drum Company, is a family-friendly celebration of live music and dance featuring nine Bay Area ensembles, and American Bon Dancing on September 8 is a joyous Japanese Buddhist celebration and SF Indigenous Peoples Day on October 14.
