(San Francisco, CA, April 1, 2025) - Yerba Buena Gardens Festival announces the programming for its 25th Anniversary Season of free outdoor music, theater, circus, dance, poetry, and children's programs at Yerba Buena Gardens. The Festival's 25th season opens on Saturday, May 10 at 2:00pm with the return of Festival favorites - Grammy-winning **La Santa Cecilia** and an opening set from San Francisco's own **La Doña**. The 25th Anniversary season will honor the Festival's long history of presenting local, national, and international artists by bringing back Festival favorites and welcoming new

artists. The season will celebrate the Festival's tradition of commissioning new works and collaborating with a wide-range of local arts and community partners.

**Thursday Luchtime Concert Series** takes place on Thursdays from 12:30pm to 1:30pm and features local and international musicians including **CMC Older Adults Choirs** on May 15, **Aguidavi do Jeje x Batuki** on May 22, **VEN Trio of Vinicius Gomez, Elé Howell, Noah Garabedian** on May 29, **Sundra Manning** on June 19, **Mahsa & Marjan Vahdat** on June 26, **Shirley Kazuyo Muramoto** on July 10, **Arun Ramamurthy Trio** on July 17, **Dani Offline** on July 24, **AfroSolo Arts Festival Presents Lady Bianca & The West Coast Caravan of All-Stars** on August 7, **Brazil in the Gardens** on August 14, **WAM Local Sirens Presents B. DeVeaux + Mare** on August 21, **Trío Guadalevín** on August 28, **Bia Ferreira** on September 25, and **Lucía** on October 2.

The Festival unveils a new First Thursday Dance Night in the Yerba Buena East Garden and will present **Lavay Smith & Her Red Hot Skillet Lickers** on July 3, **Combo Chimbita** on Thursday, August 7, and more to be announced.

Dance has always been a major part of the Yerba Buena Gardens Festival and this season is no different. **YBG ChoreoFest** returns on Saturday, July 19 and Saturday, July 26 for the two-weekend festival of site-specific work that showcases the extravagant creativity, diversity, and vibrancy of the Bay Area dance scene, curated by Ashley Gayle and David Herrera. YBG ChoreoFest choreographers and companies include **Jocelyn Reyes/REYES Dance**, **SNJV**, **In Lak'ech**, **Charya Burt**, **Kyle Limin**, **Erin Yen**, **David Herrera Performance Company** and **PUSH Dance Company**. The open-air dance studio at **YBG Dance Day** on July 20 welcomes dancers of all ages and levels. Weekly dance workout classes from **Rhythm & Motion** occur every Wednesday. The Festival will present the World Premiere of *the way home is an upwards spiral* from choreographer **SAMMAY** for two performances on Saturday, August 23 and Sunday, August 24. The experimental, site-responsive work will push the boundaries of street dance forms and challenge western notions of concert dance. The Festival welcomes back the Hawaiian dance of **Nā Lei Hulu I Ka Wēkiu: Aloha 'Aina** on June 14, **Gamelan Sekar Jaya** on July 5 returns to YBG Festival to present new work of Balinese dance, and **Parangal Dance Company** on October 4 presents its first full-length outdoor program at YBG.

Yerba Buena Gardens Festival will present festivals and cultural celebrations with a wide-range of partners. On May 18, guest presenter **826 Valencia** will present its **Storytellers' Showcase** with students from across 826 Valencia's programs. The **26th Annual Native Contemporary Arts Festival** on Father's Day June 15, is a traditional event that showcases a diverse program of Native music, dance, spoken word, visual artists, vendors, and crafts. On June 28, the Festival welcomes **Pride in Yerba Buena!** celebrating queer artistic expression and honoring the LGBTQIA community of San Francisco. **San Francisco Mime Troupe** presents a new theatrical work on July 6. **Viet Day** on August 2 celebrates Vietnamese heritage in the Bay Area and will present **Vân-Ánh Võ's Blood Moon Orchestra**, a genre-bending musical collective that pushes the boundaries of Vietnamese traditional music. The **31st Annual Pistahan** on August 9 and 10 is a two-day showcase of Filipino and Filipino-American arts and culture. In partnership with MoAD & SFJAZZ, the Festival presents **Dani Offline** on July 24 and **Samora Pinderhughes + SOL Development** on September 20. San Francisco's largest literary festival **Litquake Out Loud + Book Fair** returns to the Gardens on September 28 to celebrate the Bay Area's literary community.

New this season, the Yerba Buena Gardens Festival launches a Poet-in-Residence program and names **Nia Pearl** as the first participant. Pearl is the award-winning poet, writer, and environmental justice advocate working at the intersection of art, activism, and public engagement. This inaugural residency will organize the Poetic Tuesdays series on July 22 and August 19, curate interactive writing workshops on July 26 and August 16, and create site-specific poetry in response to the musical performances throughout the festival as well as the physical environment of the Yerba Buena Gardens.

**Yerba Buena Gardens Festival Children's Garden Series** features interactive performances specially designed for kids and their adults. The Series runs from June to August in the Yerba Buena Children's Garden at Fourth and Howard Streets. The kiddie-popular series presents **Red Panda Acrobats** on June 6, **RhythmALLogy** on June 13, **Circus Bella** on June 20 & 21, **Eddie Madril** on June 27, **Ka-Hon** on July 11, **Unique Derique** on July 18, **Manilatown Ancestral Ensemble** on July 25, and **Dholrhythms Dance Company** on August 1. The series ends with the **25th Annual Halloween Hoopla** on Saturday, November 1 at Noon.
